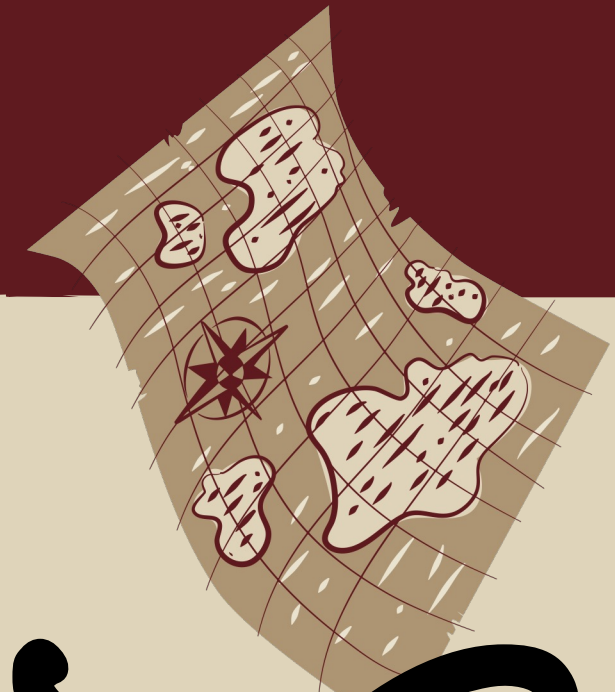

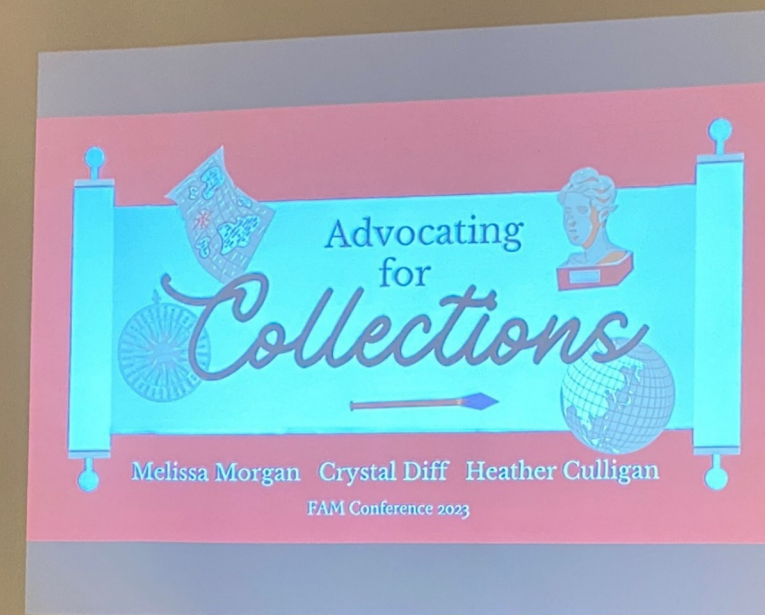

Manatee County Agricultural Museum

Advocating for Space & Physical Resources



- Small museum with two full time staff
- Part of the Manatee County Clerk of the Circuit Court's Historical Resources Department
- Non-profit formed in 1989, Museum opened in 2002 with collections scattered throughout various storage facilities
- First Curator hired in 2014

Advocating for Space & Physical Resources

- Challenges
 - No Collections Storage
 - Almost everything exhibited
- Resources Needed
 - Archival housing
 - Space to hold and process incoming collections

Tampa Bay History Center

Advocating for Time



- Larger museum
- Five full time staff in Collections/Curatorial
- 90,000+ items in collection
- Two satellite campuses, with two more in the works

Advocating for Time



- Chinsegut Hill Historic Site, Brooksville, FL
- Advocated for:
 - Supplies
 - Time
 - Change in priorities

Tampa Bay History Center

Advocating for Time



- Moseley Homestead, Brandon, FL
- Advocated for:
 - Time (again) which led to...
 - Part-time staff person!
 - Supplies, office space, facilities

Tampa Bay History Center

Advocating for Time Takeaways



- Your time is valuable and quantifiable
- Spreading yourself too thin compromises your ability to do your primary responsibilities
- Come from a place of “YES,” but don’t be a doormat!
- Project is possible, but here’s what I need to be successful

Advocating for Time Questions

Connecting to the Community



- Small museum with 2 FT staff (only one FT staff for 20 years)
- Established non-profit in 2005
- About 10,000 items, mostly in off-site storage and archival
- Remote location on Gasparilla Island

Connecting to the Community

Boca Grande Land Company “Magna Carta” Collection



Challenges:

- Cost to conserve (~\$27,000 for 6 books)
- Environment/Housing needed
- Found out of state in TN

Connections:

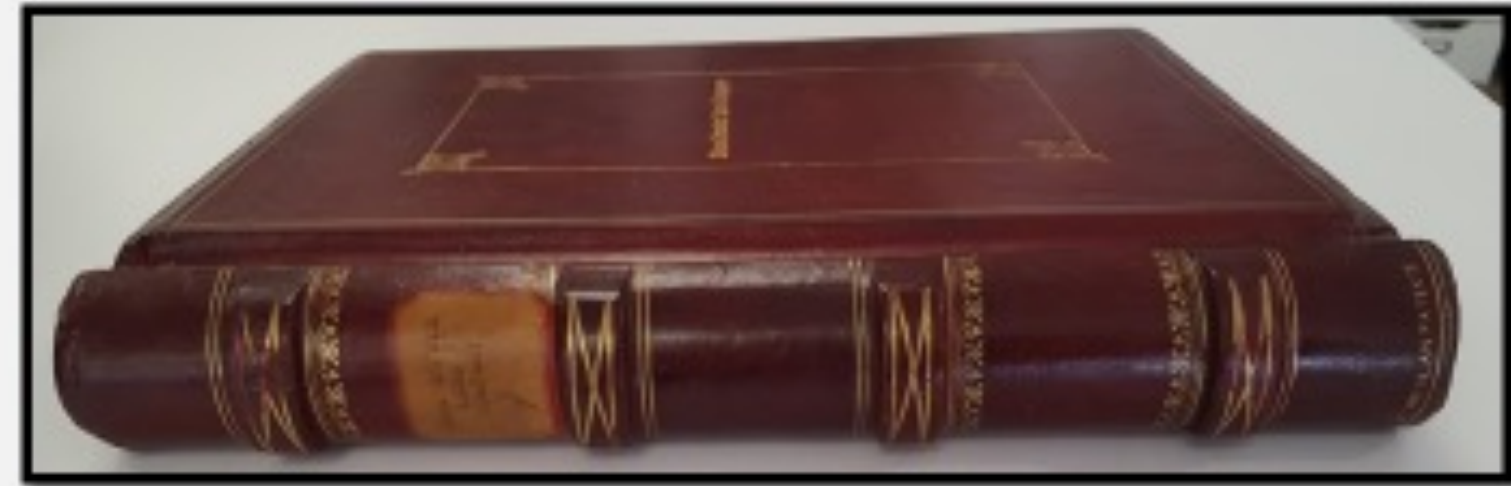
- Original documents of land development on the island
- Signatures of local icons like FL Governor Albert Gilchrist (Gilchrist Blvd.) and Peter Bradley, Pres. CH&N Railroad & AAC Co. (Phosphate)

Boca Grande Historical Society

Connecting to the Community

- Created awareness of the project in the community through press releases in local paper, videos, member emails, social media
- Acquired a local realty business to sponsor the project, and local grants from The Boca Grande Woman's Club and Gulf Coast Community Foundation
- Educated our sponsors and visitors about the connections and process from start to finish
- Continues to be a focal point in the museum and one of our most prized collections

Connecting to the Community

The Value of Connection

Showcasing your own collections enhances all aspects of your museum. It helps the community to see a part of the organization's efforts that are usually behind closed doors and brings in visitors, sponsors/ revenue, publicity, and increased local interest which elevates the entire organization.

- Do you have a success story to share on raising needed funds to conserve an artifact/collection? Would you do anything differently if done over again?
- Have a project but don't know where to start? Let's brainstorm some ideas to fit your needs.



Things to Ponder

- What connections can you make between individual collections and your community? (Ex. blueprints and local architect or developer sponsor)
- If you spend the time and funds conserving an item or collection, will it have proper housing once finished?
- Before spending your time and funds, are the items connected to your mission? Have you prioritized?
